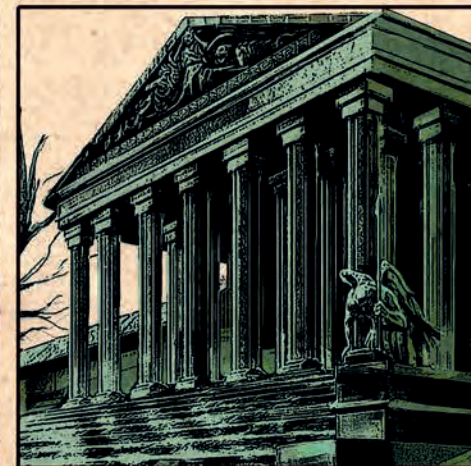

The Miskatonic Museum you see today began its life as part of Farnsworth College of the Liberal Sciences here at Miskatonic University. In 1875, after witnessing the popularity of the new Museum of Natural History in New York, and recognizing the role of museums in promoting a popular appreciation for the value of knowledge, our then-dean, Dr. Thomas Sampson Ward began opening selected parts of the university's collections to the public on holidays, before the building you stand in today was constructed in 1890.

Since then, the Miskatonic Museum has welcomed visitors daily from Arkham, the wider Miskatonic Valley, Massachusetts and beyond. We hope you will enjoy your time with us, witnessing the sometimes surprising discoveries our little museum has to offer.
